**SUSTAINABLE GLEN ROCK**

Cindy reviewed the Spreadsheet she created for Sustainable Jersey Certification. Glen Rock has over the 100 points needed for certification but documentation is needed to support the information and must be submitted by Sept. 9.

Paul Sharar and Francesco Liberti are serving as leads for the Energy portion of the Sustainable Glen Rock Committee which is projected to be submitted in 2010. They will be taking the following steps:

- Use Energy Usage/Cost Facts for each municipal facility for the last 5 years as a base for analysis & planning. (PSE&G has provided Energy Usage/Cost information directly for every meter of every municipal facility in Glen Rock for the year 2008 as a basis for negotiating energy contracts.)

- Specify Energy Saving Practices now in use and new practices as they are adopted.
- List Facility Changes affecting Energy Usage: Specify changes, energy ratings and dates.
- Design Town Report to compare current Use/Cost with past year and previous 5 year average with Reports on Renovations and Energy Saving Practices to be available every 6 months going forward.
- Success Stories and Problem Solving Stories to be highlighted to town at least every 6 months.
- Ask Residents, Businesses and Non-Profits to voluntarily use Municipal Model (Spreadsheet with directions for use to be available on-line and at library).
- Report Individual Success Stories and Problem Solving Stories regularly to the public.
